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Introduction

This study guide has been prepared as a study aid for students participating in the Heart of America Leadership Training for Christ (HOALTC) Bible Bowl and Bible Quiz. Questions were derived using the 2011 New International Version of the Holy Bible, and cover the following 34 chapters that address the life of Moses:

Exodus 1 – 20 Numbers 10 – 14 Numbers 20 – 24 Deuteronomy 31 – 34

The HOALTC Bible Bowl is a closed-book, individual event that tests for knowledge of the material. The HOALTC Bible Quiz is an open-book, team event that measures both knowledge and resourcefulness. The rules for each event can be found in the HOALTC Manual, which can be downloaded at www.hoaltc.org. You are encouraged to read the rules thoroughly to identify and register for the event for which you are best suited.

Because the HOALTC Bible Quiz is comprised of five separate tests, each covering approximately 1/5th of the material, the Study Guide is divided into five sections. They are:
